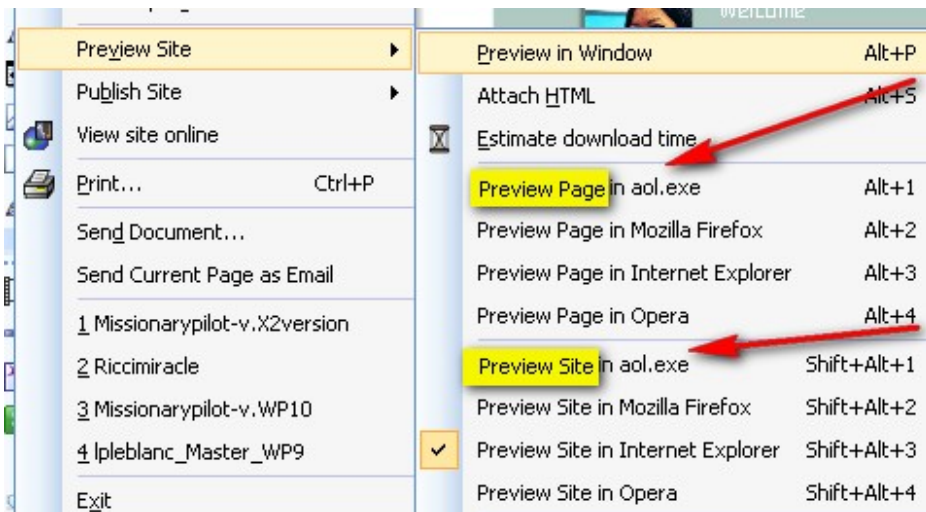
How do I preview my site now that it is complete?

Question: I've completed my website, but when I try to preview it, none of the links seem to work and I cannot move from page to page within the site.

Answer: This is one of those problems that stumps even the experienced users from time to time.

Your website is underway, or complete, and you want to preview how it will look to site visitors. You've clicked on FILE | PREVIEW SITE, but when you view your page in your web browser, nothing seems to happen. None of those page links you slaved over are activated.

The problem is very likely that you are previewing a single page of your site, not the entire site. If you click on FILE | PREVIEW SITE from within WebPlus, you'll get a menu flyouts that looks like the one below:



You'll note that once you've clicked on FILE | PREVIEW SITE, that there is still another menu flyout that allows you to choose a browser in which to do your previewing. (*The browsers shown will depend on what has been installed on your computer.*) Unless you choose PREVIEW SITE here, then your preview may default to PREVIEW PAGE, which will result in only a single page of your site being previewed.

NOTE: The PREVIEW PAGE option does exactly what it says. It allows you to preview a single page of your site...probably the one you were last working on. However, none of the links will be active. PREVIEW PAGE is very quick to load into your browser and is useful when you want to have an on-going look at how your page is going to look to your site visitor once the site goes "live" and is published.

Go back and click on FILE | PREVIEW SITE | PREVIEW SITE IN...and choose the browser that is installed on your computer, or one of the browsers currently installed. Your preview should load and appear normally now. As a side note, it's a good idea to preview your site in a number of browsers, just to get an idea of what your site visitor is seeing when they visit your site, if they are using a browser that is different than the one you normally use.
